Gamaliel was a highly respected Rabbi and teacher. Saul (Paul) was a bright and zealous student. He may have had a promising future as a Jewish religious leader. Neither teacher nor student were aware that God was working with both of them to prepare Paul to play a major role in establishing His church. After getting Paul's attention the hard way God used him to write two thirds of the New Testament and to spread the gospel of Christ to that part of the world.

Just as and Paul and Gamaliel weren't aware that God was doing a work in them, we are often unaware when God is preparing us.

Homophone: a word that is pronounced the same but differs in spelling and meaning.

Prays is a verb meaning to communicate with God. It is the "talking" to God in which we reveal our feelings and thoughts; make supplications for our needs and for those of others; and honor our God through the expression of our hearts. Praying does not require a time limit, a particular stance, nor a specific place. Prayers can be quietly spoken heart to heart. Prayers can be a song. Prayers can be shouted from the roof tops. Prayers can be spoken by whole congregations or just a one-on-one experience with God. Our God is always listening...always ready to join us in conversation. His desire to draw close to His children is evident in Scripture and deeply felt in our spirits. God has not made His desire for us to come into His presence a secret. Rather, God is very vocal on how He longs for us to be with Him...to call out to Him...to rely on Him. We pray and we seek that which only a loving and faithful God gave give.

Praise is a verb meaning to express warm approval or admiration, respect, and gratitude as in an act of worship. It is the honoring of God for all that He is.... for all that He has done, is doing, and will do. It is how we honor the Most High God from the depths of our being. We can praise quietly in the solemnness of alone time with God. We can praise at the top of our lungs while driving in the car. We can praise in Church, at a concert, around the campfire, on holidays and every day. We can praise as we call out for His help. We praise when we acknowledge His goodness, mercy, and grace. We can sing our praise to Him with or without music. Our God is always listening...always ready to hear His sons and daughters tell of His greatness. God has not made His desire for us to worship and praise Him a secret. Rather, He expects praise. He is worthy of praise. God awaits the praises of His people.

I think Prays and Praise are more than homophones. Are they not also mirror images of our relationships to our Eternal Father? When we pray, we are recognizing that God is greater than ourselves and holds the key to all we need. When we praise, we are recognizing that we are loved, and we celebrate the wonder and holiness of our God. There is power when we pray and there is power when we praise. That power is the glory of the one true God!

The one who prays to God will praise God. Our prayers and our praise are connected to God for that is what He requires of His children.


Flint Street News




